- Campuses partner with Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Programs (VITA) to host tax prep on campus.

- VITA events are open to the general public, but can benefit low-income students at the institution.
- VITA events build community-campus relations.

## Implementation

Campuses that partner with Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Programs (VITA) provide a service to the community as well as their low-income students. In order to optimize the programs benefits most schools will use students as volunteers, providing valuable experience and a possible service learning opportunity for the student.

Many schools likely have VITA locations nearby already, so if your school does not host one, be sure you know where to send students to find a location (see "Tools to File for Free" to the right).
