- **★ Eve Hill,** Deputy Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Rights Division, US Department Of Justice. Previously served as Senior Vice President of the Burton Blatt Institute at Syracuse University where she was responsible for the Institute's work on ADA. She was the District of Columbia's first Director of the Office of Disability Rights and Executive Director of the Disability Rights Legal Center, a leading nonprofit disability advocacy group in Los Angeles. She was a Supervisory Attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice's Disability Rights Section, where she supervised ADA investigations, created the Department's ADA Mediation Program, and developed the Department's ADA building code certification program. As visiting Associate Professor at Loyola Law School and an Adjunct Professor at the University of Southern California School of Law, she taught disability rights, and dispute resolution.
- **→ Dan Goldstein**, Counsel for the National Federation of the Blind, with Brown, Goldstein & Levy, Baltimore, Maryland. In the field of nonvisual access to educational technology, he has reached a broad ranging settlements with various Higher Education Systems and to cease procuring inaccessible technology, engage in a self-audits and create a remediation plans.
- **★ Scott Lissner**, President, Association on Higher Education and Disability, and Ohio State University ADA Coordinator; currently President of the Association on Higher Education and Disability and serves on the Board of Directors for ADA-OHIO. Recent publications include "Universal Design in the Institutional Setting: Weaving a Philosophy into Campus Planning"
- **Tim Creagan,** Senior Accessibility Specialist United States Access Board. He is lead staff on the ongoing 508 Refresh of the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Standards and Guidelines. Mr. Creagan is a nationally recognized expert on accessible electronic and information technology and telecommunications.
- **♦ Ron Stewart**, Managing Consultant Altformat Solutions LLC, and Technology Advisor to AHEAD: The Association on Higher Education and Disability. Ron Chairs the AHEAD E-Text Solutions Group and is member of the NIMAS Board. In 2001 Ron helped found the Access Technologist Higher Education Network and serves as the organizations President. Currently Ron is the Managing Consultant for AltFormat Solutions; a consulting and training organization focusing on solutions to curricular access.
