






### Enrollment by ACT scores for recent HS grads






### Tennessee Promise: An overview


- Main features:
  - Tuition-free attendance at a community or technical college
  - Last-dollar scholarship after Pell, TSAA, Lottery
  - 5 semesters of eligibility
  - Guidance from mentors
- Requirements:
  - Full-time enrollment
  - Recent high school graduate
  - 8 hours of community service a semester
  - Satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA)



#### THE COLLEGE SYSTEM Promise students: Percent of recent HS grad enrollment












### **DT** HE COLLEGE SYSTEM Promise student share by demographics


### Fall 2015 freshmen by ACT composites & Pell Status







#### **C**THE COLLEGE SYSTEM Enrollment status after two years









### Trends in awards for TBR community colleges





## **T**CAT certificates and diplomas



### Key takeaways from the Promise cohort analysis

#### • TN Promise impacts:

THE COLLEGE SYSTEM

- Accelerated college enrollment
- Bringing in more students into community colleges / higher education
- Encouraging more full-time enrollment
- Changes in academic preparation profile
  - Greatest increases occurred at the low ACT spectrum
- Accelerated award rates
- Optimism about outcomes in the 5<sup>th</sup> term of enrollment
- Other observations:
  - Persisting academic challenges
  - Re-defining student success
    - Focusing on both certificates and associate degrees
